Officer Comments

Wildflower Event

Mike Kaliczak from the Sheriff's Comm Reserve filled everyone in on the Wildflower event details and invited people to see / ride the Support And Gear (SAG) Wagon and to come to Com2 when finished with assignment.

Mike Kalczak also indicated that there will be a LOCO challenge event on June 3 that starts at 0600 and ends after dark; he is looking for volunteer support and can use help.

Mike Kaliczak also indicated that NVADG just received some radio equipment and could use help from amateur operators to get things set up and to do some training.
